

EECS 395 Objective-C Style Guide

The guidelines here are a simplified/relaxed form of the Apple's guidelines, available here: <http://developer.apple.com/documentation/Cocoa/Conceptual/CodingGuidelines/CodingGuidelines.html>

- Class names start with a capital letter, are singular, don't have any underscores, and all words begin capitalized:
 - Good:
 - Recipe
 - RecipeViewController
 - RecipeDetailView
 - Bad:
 - recipe
 - Recipes
- Variables start with a lowercase letter, don't have any underscores, and the first letter of all words but the first are capitalized:
 - Good:
 - Recipe *recipe;
 - NSArray *recipeArray;
 - NSArray *ingredients;
 - Bad:
 - NSArray *Recipes;
 - RecipeViewController *view_controller;
- Each chunk of a method name starts with a lowercase letter, later words' first letters are capitalized, no underscores, no abbreviations (except super common ones like XML, JPEG, etc.)
 - Good:
 - -recipeWithID:
 - -writeRecipe:toDatabase:
 - -combineIngredientsFromRecipe:withIngredientsFromRecipe:
 - Bad:
 - SetRecipe:
 - setCQFW:
 - combineQw:andDesc
